LEOPIZZI Bruno, age 87, of Totowa, formerly of Paterson, on October 29. Bruno was a Superior Court Judge for 19 years, serving in Passaic County, retiring in 1992. He was a member of the Passaic County Bar Association and the New Jersey Bar Association. He was a lecturer at the American Inns of Court, an adjunct professor of Criminal Law at Seton Hall Law School, a member of the Italian Circle, the Alumni Association of Drew University, and the Gettone Club, a benefactor of St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center and the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. He was an avid golfer and Yankee fan. He loved his family and was especially proud of all his grandchildren. He is survived by his beloved wife Theresa (nee Luzzi), his son Raymond and his wife Karen of Totowa, his daughters, Elaine and her husband Judge Raymond Reddin of Totowa, and Terriann and her husband John Contini of Paterson, his sisters Anna DeCrescenzo and Antoinette McSheffrey, both of Pompton Lakes, his grandchildren Christopher Leopizzi, Cara Carnemolla, and Ray, Ryan, Anthony and Michael Reddin, and his great grandchild Giovanni Carnemolla, and also many nieces and nephews.
